Resource Clearinghouse

The Center for Safe Schools maintains a library with over 4,000 resources available for loan to schools and the public. Resources include nearly 400 videotapes, over 1,100 books, and 174 curricula. Other examples of resources in the lending library include research journals, newsletters, and other print materials.

More than 1,000 of the library's resources specifically address violence prevention and school safety. Other resources in the lending library address topics which also impact the safety, education and success of children, families and their communities, including such topics as literacy, poverty, migrant education, dropout prevention, mentoring, preventing teen pregnancy, preventing substance abuse or helping students with substance abuse problems, community collaborations, technology in the schools, education reform ideas, school-to-work, and many more. Resource materials reflect different cultures and ethnic groups, including some Spanish language materials. The resources are suited for various ages, grades and reading levels.

The Center for Safe Schools provides technical assistance and links to resources for the prevention of school violence as well as for recovery after traumatic events.
