


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Protocols for Responding to COVID-19





ASD COVID-19 EXCLUSION FROM SCHOOL GUIDELINES

Exclusion From and Retun to School Requirements			
COVID-19 Symptoms Two of the following symptoms: fever (measured or subjectivve) chills, fatigue, myalgia, headache, sore throat, congestion or running nose, nauswa, vomiting, or diarrhea. OR One of the following symptoms: cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, or new loss of teaste or smell	 Individuals should seek guidance from health care provider: If test result is negative OR doctor's note with differential diagnosis, return to school after 24 afebrile and improved respiratory symptons If test result is positive or individual is unable/refuses to get tested, may return to schoolafter: 24 hours with no fever and Improvements in symptoms and 10 days since symptoms first appeared If sent home by school nurse for COVID like symptoms, a doctor's note is required to return. 		
Positive COVID-19 PCR or Antigen (Point of Care) Test	WITH SYMPTOMS WITHOUT SYMPTOMS May return to school after: Avareturn to school after: • 24 hours with no fever AND, • 10 days after specimen was collected • Improvements in symptoms AND • 10 days after specimen was collected • 10 days since symptoms first appeared Is ymptoms develop during the 10 days, follow return to school guidance for positive PCR or Antigen test <u>WITH</u> symptoms

Close Contact to Positive* Within 6ft for 15 minutes or more Household contact Exception: In the K-12 indoor classroom setting only, the close contact definition excludes students who were within 3 to 6 feet of an infected student (laboratory-confirmed or a clinically compatible illness) where: both students were engaged in consistent and correct use of well-fitting masks and This excention does not annuly to teachers staff or 	Individuals should seek guidance from their health care provider. May return to school after: • 24 hours with no fever AND • improvement in symptoms AND • 10 days since symptoms first appeared	Quarantine can end 10 days after exposure without testing OR after 7 days with a negative PCR or antigen test (must be collected on day 5 or thereafter). Household contacts may require further investigation, by either OPH or school officials, to determine dates of quaratine. Documentation of negative COVID-19 test must be provided to school to end quarantine before day 11.	 People who are vaccinated against COVID-19 do NOT need to quarantine after an exposure to another person with COVID-19 if they meet <u>ALL</u> of the following criteria: They are fully vaccinated (i.e. ≥2 weeks following receipt of the second dose in a 2-dose series, or ≥2 weeks following receipt of one dose of a single-dose vaccine) <u>AND</u> They have remained asymptomatic since the current COVID-19 exposure. The date of vaccination is day 0 when determining if an individual is fully vaccinated (i.e., >2 weeks post vaccine dose).
 This exception does not apply to teachers, staff, or other adults in the indoor classroom setting. 		The most protective recommended quaratine remains 14 days post exposure. It is recommended that symptom monitoring continue until day 14. If symptoms develop during the 14 days, follow return to school guidance for Close Contact with symptoms.	Antietam School District

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
