SCHOOL PROFILE

→ Community

Residential, two miles southeast of downtown Reading. Population 7,500. Borough of Mount Penn and Lower Alsace Township in Berks County.

Special Circumstances

Over the summer of 2023, the Middle/Senior High School building experienced a devasting flood, rendering the school building unusable and displacing all students for the school year. To accommodate for this disaster, the school district rearranged school-year plans in a matter of weeks to ensure students obtain an effective in-person education. The community and our students agreed on a plan to utilize the district elementary school, primary center, and a local church to house classrooms and allow students to walk between buildings, to wherever their classrooms are relocated. Beginning in August of 2024, we are now Antietam High School, serving students in grades 9-12. For 12th graders, we require that students take only the credits needed to graduate, and they are encouraged to pursue other opportunities outside of school such as college courses, community service, extra work hours, and/or internships. Our students have demonstrated great resilience and flexibility to ensure the success of the school year and the advancement of their education.

➤ Curriculum

Course offerings are academic, with Honors and Advanced Placement levels. All students are scheduled individually, with input from students, parents, and staff. Scheduling for academic subjects follows the philosophy of the district that students in this age group learn best when grouped in academically appropriate clusters of students with similar ability and motivation. Curricula include the options of attending Berks Career and Technology Center, distance learning, community service, head start to college at local universities and colleges. Minimum credit requirement for graduation is 23 credits and must include core courses.
