## Tips & Tricks for Nurturing Literacy at Home for Early Readers

Before Reading	During Reading	After Reading
Take a picture walk	Make connections	Reread to build fluency

Ask questions to create	Sound out tricky words	Create alternate endings
a purpose for reading	& notice familiar words	

## Encourage your reader to...

- -Read anything with words: recipes, grocery lists, newspapers, magazines, etc.
- -Read independently, or read to a stuffed animal, sibling, grown up, or pet
- -Build reading stamina
- -Maintain a journal to write/draw about his/her reading
- -Talk about what they are reading and explain their thinking

## More Tips & Tricks

- -Read aloud to your child & model fluency and expression, by using silly & exaggerated voices
- -Take turns reading with your child
- -Ask questions before, during, and after reading
- -Be a reading and writing role model
- -Share your favorite books with your child
- -Write notes to your child
- -Use new and interesting words in your conversations
- -Praise your child's reading progress and effort
- -Be patient with your reader
- -Give your reader think time when sounding out new or unfamiliar words
- -Practice reading and writing sight words in a multitude of exciting ways
