The Boys High School Soccer team finished the fall with an impressive 13-7 record. The team lost a heartbreaking district game to Camp Hill 3-2 in penalty kicks which ultimately ended the season. The District III Girls and Boys Cross Country Meet took place on Saturday, October 26 at Big Spring High School.
