If symptoms subside after 5 days, the isolation period ends, however, person must wear a mask at all times around others until day 10.	If person tests positive, refer to "Scenario A."	If person is unvaccinated or is eligible (more than 6 months after primary vaccine series) but has not yet received a booster: Quarantine at home for 5 days, then wear a mask at all times until day 10.			

Any person who returns to school after the 5-day isolation/quarantine period who is still exhibiting symptoms **WILL** be sent home at the discretion of school personnel.

*Persons returning to school from quarantine after day 5, who are unvaccinated, or not fully vaccinated, will be seated in a separate and socially distanced area to eat lunch, until the 10-day period has ended, as to avoid being unmasked around others.

**Persons returning to school from quarantine after day 5, who are unvaccinated, or not fully vaccinated, will be required to remain masked during active engagement in extra-curricular activities until the 10-day period has ended, as to avoid being unmasked around others.

COVID-19 Symptoms

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), people with COVID-19 have a wide range of symptoms. Symptoms may appear two–14 days after exposure to the virus. COVID-19 symptoms may include:



- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting
- Diarrhea

This list does not include all possible symptoms. The CDC will continue to update this list as they learn more about COVID-19.

Definition of Exposure (Per PA DOH)

Exposure occurs when there is a physical contact (contact within six feet for 15 consecutive minutes or more) between an infected person and yourself.

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Guidelines for Extra-Curricular Activities in the Event of a Shift to Virtual Instruction

In the event that the ASD must transition to Virtual Instruction for a period of time, guidelines for extra-curricular activities will be dependent upon the reason for the shift to virtual instruction. The following table summarizes the guidelines for each possible scenario:

If the shift to Virtual Instruction is due to:

Staff Shortage	Community Spread (Staff or Students) Contained to one building	Community Spread (Staff or Students) District-Wide
<ul style="list-style-type: none">•All Extra-Curricular activities will continue as scheduled, as long as the advising staff member/coach is able to moderate the activity.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•All Extra-Curricular activities will continue as scheduled with the following restrictions:•Students/Staff who work in or attend the affected building, who are symptomatic, or are deemed close contacts, may not participate in activities.•The activity will be cancelled if the advising staff member is not able to moderate the activity, and a suitable substitute cannot be obtained.•The activity may need to be cancelled if the areas in the building used by the activity or group need to be cleaned, or if the building needs to be closed.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">•All Extra-Curricular activities will continue as scheduled with the following restrictions:•Students/Staff who are symptomatic, or are deemed close contacts, may not participate in activities.•The activity will be cancelled if the advising staff member is not able to moderate the activity, and a suitable substitute cannot be obtained.•The activity may need to be cancelled if the areas in the building(s) used by the activity or group need to be cleaned, or if the building(s) need to be closed.

ASD masking guidelines **MUST** be followed during extra-curricular activities.

Students who are returning after a 5-day isolation/quarantine, must be masked **AT ALL TIMES**, even during active play, until day 10.

***ASD Administration reserves the right to make the final determination for all extra-curricular activities and community activities that utilize ASD buildings.**
