Dear Antietam School District Parents, Guardians, and Community Members:

I am pleased to announce that the Antietam School Board expects to appoint Dr. Timothy Matlack as its new Superintendent of Schools, during a special Board Meeting this Thursday, July 25 at 6 p.m.

Dr. Matlack is rejoining the Antietam School District (ASD) from Tulpehocken Area School District, where he currently serves as Director of Teaching and Learning. Prior to this position, he held several roles within the ASD. He began his career in education as an English Teacher for the Antietam Middle-Senior High School, then served as Assistant Principal and K-12 Curriculum Supervisor for ASD. Dr. Matlack is a respected education leader within Berks County, and most notably the Antietam school community. He has consistently demonstrated his commitment to our students and staff, and we are excited to welcome him back to guide our district forward.



The Antietam School District School Board sincerely appreciates the input and feedback from parents, guardians, and community members who assisted us during the search process that was facilitated by the Berks County Intermediate Unit. Our School Board interviewed several qualified candidates and Dr. Matlack's selection was enthusiastically endorsed by our interview team.

We are confident that Dr. Matlack's leadership and experience will positively impact our district, leading our students, staff, and community to new heights. We are also grateful to the Tulpehocken School District's willingness to allow Dr. Matlack to quickly transition into this new role, given the many significant changes facing ASD for the start of the school year. His expected start date is July 29, 2024, pending Board approval and appointment.

We are also pleased that Acting Superintendent Dr. Brett Cooper, a veteran retired administrator who is knowledgeable and well respected, will continue in a supporting leadership role as Dr. Matlack transitions into the superintendency.

We will be setting up dates and times for Dr. Matlack to meet with our parents and community members, and we know he looks forward to returning to a school community he called home for many years. Please join the School Board in congratulating Dr. Matlack.
