
Graduation Pathways

Beginning with the Class of 2023



Option 1: Keystone Proficiency Pathway

 Students are Proficient or Advanced on each Keystone exam: Algebra 1, Biology and Literature

We did not have Keystone exams last spring due to Covid. However, if your 10th grader was scheduled to take the Algebra 1 and/or Biology Keystone last spring, PA has stated that if the student passed their related Keystone course (Algebra 1 or Biology), they will automatically receive a **Proficient** in the Keystone.

Therefore, if your student is currently taking 10th grade English, and they score Proficient on the upcoming spring exam, they will have met their state graduation requirement pathway.

Option 2: Keystone Composite Pathway

Students earn a satisfactory composite score (4452) on the Algebra 1, Biology and Literature exams

Students must also earn one proficient score on one of the 3 exams and no less than a basic score on the other two tests

Option 3: Alternate Assessment Pathway

Pass the local course associated with each Keystone Exam on which the student did not achieve proficiency <u>and one of the following</u>:

a. Established score on an approved alternate assessment (SAT, PSAT, ACT, ASVAB, AP, IB)

- b. Successful completion of a concurrent course
- c. Successful completion of a pre-apprenticeship program

d. Accepted in an accredited 4-year nonprofit institution of higher education and have evidence of the ability to enroll in college-level

Option 4: Evidence-based Pathway

Pass the local classes associated with each Keystone Exam on which the student did not achieve proficiency and demonstration of <u>three pieces of</u> <u>evidence</u> consistent with the student's goals and career plans:

Using AT LEAST ONE of the following:

Three pieces of evidence consistent with the student's goals and career plans

Option 5: CTE (Career Technical Education) Pathway

Pass local courses associated with each Keystone Exam on which the student did not achieve proficiency

<u>AND</u>

Attainment of an industry-based competency certification related to the CTE program of study

<u>OR</u>

Demonstration of a high likelihood of success on an approved industry-based competency assessment or readiness for continued meaningful engagement in the CTE program of study.
